“ I've often thought of Pa Walker from my times of visiting the farm back in the 80's and 90's. How twice a day he went to check over his cows - every morning and every evening. He would drive into the field, and they, including the big bull, would all come over to his driver side window like a pack of pets, looking for some good head-scratching and kind words, which he always had for them. He would sometimes bring along a tray holding various ointments and salves for any minor cuts and scrapes they collected - each cow got an inspection and if needed, a doctoring. I remember when he put a sick calf up in the barn near the house and laboriously treated it for scours, nursing it back to health, even though it was, as he said, a money-losing exercise.

And how, when livestock chores of the day were done and dusk had come, he liked to sit in his chair and listen to the big band music on the radio, his face alive with memories of earlier times. Or he'd opt to watch "Lawrency Boy" on public TV - what he dubbed those endless Lawrence Welk Show reruns, and he'd poke some gentle fun at the wobbly ballerina guest stars. Or he would be game to just talk and debate the whole evening away.

So many good memories of my moments with him. A patriarch has passed. Condolences to the whole Walker family, both those I've known and those I've never met.
