Terry Don King, 50, of Springdale, Arkansas, died Sunday, December 9, 2018 in Springdale. He was a Mechanical Engineer and a veteran of the U.S. Marines. He was born August 8, 1968 in Ozark, Arkansas to Keith King and Sandra Gibson.

He is survived by his wife, Kari King of Springdale; his mother, Sandra Lewis of Mulberry, Arkansas; his father, Keith King; a son, Austin King of Van Buren, Arkansas and daughter, London King of Mulberry; two stepsons, Stephen and Mathew Pratt, both of Springdale, and a stepdaughter, Shelby Cole of Springdale; and one grandchild.

“ According to Washington County Sheriff Public Information Officer, Kelly Cantrell, deputies arrived to 19496 Neills Bluff Road off County Road 550 in Springdale at around 9:45 p.m. on Sunday evening, after receiving a call on a reported domestic disturbance.

Upon arriving at the location, deputies found three people safe, outside of the home. But another victim and the suspect were still inside.

As deputies made their way into the house and upstairs, the suspect identified as Terry Don King, 50, who pointed a shotgun at deputies, forcing them to take cover. An unknown female was able to make her way out of the bedroom and down the stairs. King once again pointed his shotgun at deputies, who then shot him. EMS tried to revive King but were unsuccessful.

The three deputies involved have been placed on administrative leave. That includes Corp. Justin Bocchino, Corp. Addison Webb, and Corp. Emilio Zacarias

Arkansas State Police will also be involved in the investigation.

King had an extensive criminal record prior to the shooting. He was arrested seven times from 1987 to 2013, with multiple felonies including aggravated assault, theft of property, and breaking and entering.

“ What can I say? Terry was one of a kind. He and I shared many a good time when we were young guys still in school. I spent a good amount of time with him and his grandparents in Coal Hill, AR. Went on family trips and summer vacations. We created some wild things back in the day. We built a soapbox car without brakes and rode it from the First Baptist Church of Coal Hill down the hill to the bottom to land in the ditch that intersected. We made a zip line from the top of his grandmother's house going across the lawn to the steel clothes line pole. We hid eggs in the hot attic in the summer to use them during Halloween. I remember riding on the back of his motorcycle and him popping wheelies and scaring me half to death. Both of us laughing our heads off til our stomachs hurt. Camping in the woods behind Robert Hurst's house with the rest of the guys. Sitting up in the attic of his grandparent's house during the summer zipped up in sleeping bags to see how long we could take the heat. He and I were the best of friends at that time and I'll never forget the great times we had together. We lost touch with one another for a good many years up until the last couple of years. Last year, he and his wife came to listen to my band play at the American Veterans Clubhouse in Fayetteville. That would be the last time we would see one another.

Terry, you're missed, you're loved, and you're remembered for the person you were. Kind, Generous, Giving, Caring, and always there with a smile. See you soon my brother. Take care.
