Jeremy Martin and Ryan Farris.

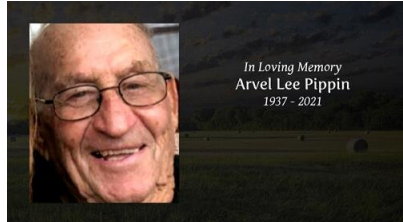
