One to New Orleans and five to Las Vegas. He loved Vegas. I moved back to Minneapolis last year June 2018. He was over when i was packing, and said he sure hated me leaving Clarksville. This last July was our last trip to Vegas. He got his first SS check in August. He was checking out some nice retirement places in Arizona. Danny called me on Wednesday the 13th and told me he had two months of pain in his elbow. He thought it was tennis elbow. Went to the doctor to find out he had cancer in his shoulder. The Doctor told Danny that it did not look good. Danny said a friend from Pine Bluff Arkansas was coming to stay with him for a few days. I don't know if that friend ever made it to Danny's. I talked to Danny for about twenty minutes. I told him i would call him everyday. If i had know he was so sick i would have came down to Ozark. The next day around noon the Franklin county sheriff's office called me. They found my number in Danny's wallet. They were looking for his family. I only knew of a Brother who he told me lived in Tupelo Mississippi. They then told me Danny was deceased. I couldn't believe what I was hearing. All I have now are the good memories of being Dannels friend. Rest in peace my friend. Will be friends again in the next life.
