



Everett G Littlepage

August 6, 1934 - April 3, 2020

On Friday, April 3rd, 2020, Everett Littlepage, a longtime resident of Ozark, passed away at the age of 85.

In 1952, he married Wanda Neldon from Clinton, Arkansas. They raised 3 children: Marvin Littlepage of Kansas City, Debbie Graves of North Little Rock, and Becki Smith of Ozark. The family lived in Fulton, MO from 1967-1977, during which time he owned and operated a stave mill and sawmill. In 1977, he moved the family back to his hometown area of Ozark, AR, where he began farming. He raised several acres of green beans and tomatoes, being mentored in farming alongside his brother, Greene Littlepage. He and his brother would take their harvest to Dallas, TX Farmer's Market every week, every summer, for many years. He loved farming, but his real passion was his faith. As one of Jehovah's Witnesses, he loved talking to others about how Bible prophecy foretold events happening now as signs we are in the Last Days (like the pestilence we see covering the earth - Pestilence was a rider of one horse of the 4 Horsemen of the Apocalypse). Everett was born August 6, 1934 to Rufus and Clemmie Littlepage of Mountain Top, AR. He was preceded in death by his parents; and seven siblings, Anna Mae Stewart, Janie Casiano, Lenora Stidham, Verda Miller, Greene Littlepage, Raymond Littlepage, and Oscar Littlepage.

Everett is survived by his wife of 67 years, Wanda Neldon of Ozark; his 3 children, Kent (Storm) Smith of Ozark, Samantha Marshall of Little Rock, Kinsey Littlepage of Columbia, MO, and Farrah Littlepage of Laos; five grandchildren; and a great grandson, Axel Littlepage-Holmes of Laos.

His parents and 7 siblings preceded him in death: Anna Mae Stewart, Janie Casiano, Lenora Stidham, Verda Miller, Greene Littlepage, Raymond Littlepage, and Oscar Littlepage.
