Icie Hobbs, 90, of Alix, Arkansas, died Wednesday, February 15, 2012 at her home. She was a Baptist and a member of VFW Ladies Auxiliary. She was a welder during WWII, and was a coal miner, being the first woman listed on the Altus miner's monument; was employed at the Ammunitions Depot in Oklahoma; she worked at Wiederkehr Vineyards. She was born January 31, 1922 in Akins, Oklahoma to Grover Cleveland and Emma Etta Masterson Humphrey. She was preceded in death by her soul mate, Wayne Phillips; and by her children Zondra and Gibson Nash and Emma Timmerman of Altus.
