James Gillett “Duck” Drake, age 91, of Altus, Arkansas passed away Monday July 18, 2022. He was of the Christian faith, a Veteran of the United States Army, and served in the Korean War. He also spent his time cultivating stunning displays of flowers for his wife, mowing his golf course worthy lawn with his ride on mower, reading, he was an avid reader, visiting and drinking coffee with his breakfast bunch at Circle M, and/or if the grandkids were

coming to town he would be sitting in his recliner watching football waiting with open arms and a flashy smile. James was born October 25, 1930 in Tolar, New Mexico to Eugene and Clara Sample Drake. He is preceded in death by his parents; one son, James (Jimmy”) Roy Drake; and a lifelong friend, Roy Lewis.

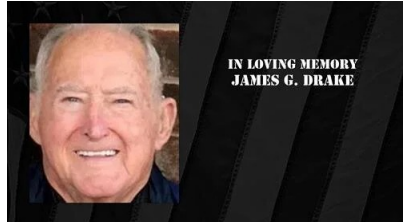
