Jerry Dwain Reeves of Ozark caught the glory train on June 30, 2014. He was born on November 28, 1931 in Shawnee, OK to Ida Fern English and Virgil McKinley Reeves. He is a member of the Diciples of Christ; a veteran of the Korean war; he served with the Oklahoma Thunderbird Division. Jerry was a 59 year member of the Tecumseh OK Masonic Lodge #69, holding a dual membership with the Tecumseh and Springdale Masonic Lodges. He served as worshipful master of the Springdale and Ozark Masonic Lodges. He was a member of the American Legion for 50 years, and also held membership with the VFW. He worked as a land man in Camden, AR and Liberty, MS, before moving to Springdale in 1959. He was the secretary, treasurer, and manager of the Washington County Title Company. He served his community as a volunteer fire fighter in Springdale and Ozark; he held many positions on city committees, including the Community Development Project, and the Boy Scouts. He moved to Ozark, Arkansas in 1989 where he purchased the Franklin County Title Company. Jerry is survived by his wife of 63 years DeMona Beasley.
