



Joseph "Jody" Marshall Chrisman

October 20, 1960 - September 5, 2025

Joseph "Jody" Marshall Chrisman passed away in Ozark on September 5, 2025. Passionate, stubborn, and enigmatically charismatic, he was never shy about sharing his in-depth technical know-how. Born in Hartman, Arkansas, to the late Marshall Chrisman Jr. and Lavern Tipton Kerr, his early life conditioned him into a knack for resourcefulness and fierce independence. He dove headfirst into a deep understanding of engines and circuitry, believing that if you didn't know how to do something, you simply figured it out. His expertise in technology became his way of connecting with the world, a calling that drove him to spearhead what would become the automation technology program at Arkansas Tech University, Ozark. For 36 years, he instructed and inspired, and his legacy is cemented in the generations of students he trained in the art and science of robotics.

His love for mechanics was matched only by his love for adventure. The remaining ripples of his energy can be found in the waters he loved, whether scuba diving in the turquoise bays of Cancun, boating with family, or ripping through the waves on a slalom ski. These adventures were always with his wife and partner of 29 years, Shannon, who understood him like no one else.

His generosity of self and passionate nature were passed down to his two daughters, Elizabeth "Liz" Chrisman (Nikkila) and Madeleine (Morgan) Wiley. He is also survived by his brothers, Mark Chrisman and Allen Kerr, and his

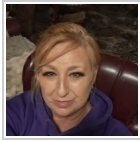
sisters, Linda (Jay) Hardin and Tresia (Johnny) Crawford. He is preceded in death by his parents, his brother, Steve Chrisman, and his sister Pam Hanuska.

Jody leaves behind a trove of memories, repaired engines, and the echo of his favorite toast, delivered whenever he felt compelled: "Here's to the frog on the mantle piece who dipped his tail in a pan of grease. Step aside brother and let him pass, the frog with the french fried ass."
