Robert "Sam" Clinton Sigman, 80, of Ozark, Arkansas passed away, Sunday, January 25, 2026 in Clarksville, Arkansas. He was born August 4, 1945 in Amhurst, Texas to Cecil Clinton Sigman and Mary Nell Hyatt Sigman. Sam was of the Baptist faith and a member of the First Baptist Church in Ozark, Arkansas. 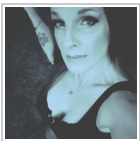
