William "Bud" Rue, 69, of Ozark, Arkansas, passed away peacefully on Thursday, September 3, 2015 in Ozark after a prolonged illness. Bud was born November 6, 1945, in Hominy, Oklahoma, and moved back to Arkansas when he was ten years old. He graduated from Ozark High School in 1963, where he made all district in football; then later from Arkansas Tech University with a bachelor's in business administration. Bud was retired from Arkansas Valley Electric where he worked as a member service representative/key accounts representative for 36 years. He also served as a member of Arkansas National Guard, 142nd Field Artillery Unit, Battery C. He had an appreciation for music, children, friends, family, history and a love for the outdoors and often enjoyed combining them on outings. He was a member of Ozark First United Methodist Church and active in the Methodist Men's program until his later years. Throughout his years in Ozark, he served on the board for the Ozark Area Chamber of Commerce where he received the lifetime achievement award in 2007. He was also involved in Rotary where he was honored with the Paul Harris award. He served as a member of the advisory committee of Arkansas Tech University Ozark Campus and was a board member of the Logan County Industrial development Corp. He was a proud member of the board of directors of the FFA Foundation and was awarded an Honorary American Degree in 2003 and many other civic and local organizations. Bud achieved the status of Master Mason and was a brother of that organization. He was preceded in death by his father, William Aud Rue and mother Kowanda Belle Wilkinson Rue-Hill.
